

"Bill, through the power and inspiration of the Holy Spirit, always sees the very best in people and pushes them to achieve remarkable goals that would be impossible to do on their own. I came to Harvest House as a homeless drug addict from Montreal who had dropped out of high school in grade 11. My life, at age 27, was an absolute failure. Bill persevered with me to overcome a 15-year drug addiction and later would invest in getting me a master's level university education crowned with an honorary doctorate. He provided me with a lifelong career at Harvest House and never once gave up on me. He became someone I could trust and rely on in the toughest times. I will always be very grateful to have Bill Main as God's minister in my life.

"February 3rd, 1988 was the day I met Bill in a Personal Development meeting at Harvest House. I met a man who told me everything about myself—the bad, the ugly, and the good. That was 35 years ago. Bill saw something in me that I did not and decided to be my sponsor from that point until today. No matter what the subject matter was, I never felt judged by my friend.

Bill has taught me to be a better man, husband, father, son, employee, and friend to others. He has taught me to "fail better". He's taught me that "this, too, shall pass". He's taught me to "measure twice and cut once". Bill's messages about recovery and God have never changed since I have known him. Bill and I were married on September 17, 1960 in Montreal, Quebec. Bill's dependence on alcohol and painkillers became a terrible addiction during the following years. In 1970 I filed for a legal separation and in 1973 I filed for a divorce. We had 3 children who were ages 11, 10 and 9 at that point but I had a good job and could support us.

This step I took prompted Bill to look for help at Alcoholic's Anonymous. As well as AA he started to attend prayer meetings with some of the group from AA, which led to a spiritual awakening. At this time, I was still living in the Montreal area with our children and Bill was living in Ottawa. In the spring of 1975 Bill came back to Montreal and we started attending a local church as a family. On September 21, 1975 we were remarried in that church. In 1977, we moved to Ottawa, and on December 1, 1979 Harvest House Ministries opened its doors.

We believed that if our faith in Jesus Christ could mend our broken relationship then HE could do it for anyone willing to put their trust in HIM. Bill became an ordained minister in 1990 and Harvest House Christian Fellowship was established. Quite an accomplishment for an alcoholic — Executive Director of Harvest House Ministries (40 years) and still the Pastor of Harvest House Christian Fellowship.

An AA slogan states the "God could and would if he were sought". How very true in Bill, my husband's life. It has been an exciting journey with the Lord in control all the way.
